
CLASS RULES



PAST SIMPLE

When we use past simple, we add ED to the verb

Tense	Subject	Verb	Complement
Present	You	Study	English
Past	I	Studied	English

When we use be, we change the verb

Tense	Subject	Verb	Complement
Present	I	Am	A teacher
Past	I	Was	A student

HOW DO WE CHANGE THE VERB?

Rules	We add	Example
1. Base form	ED	Explain - Explained
2.- Ending in E	D	Love – Loved
3.- Consonant + Y	IED	Try - Tried
4.- Ending in CVC	Double the last consonant + ed	Plan - Planned
5.- Irregular verbs	We change the word	See – Saw Fly - Flew

- Study – Studied

- Dance – Danced

- Am/is – Was

- Are – Were

- Go – Went

- Stop - Stopped

- Grow – Grew

- Sing – Sang

- Eat – Ate

- Write – Wrote

- Like – Liked

- Walk – Walked

- Move – Moved

- Cry – Cried

- Play Played

- Rob - Robbed
